About Knots Arts

Our mission is to create inclusive, friendly and fun sessions where children and young people feel safe and supported to develop their communication skills and build friendships. By meeting others who understand the challenges that social communication difficulties can bring, children are able to work together to embrace their differences and overcome any obstacles that they may present.

Our groups use drama and art to support children and young people with social communication difficulties. We work with a wide variety of children and young people, and embrace the spectrum of talents and interests that our group members bring to Knots Arts.

About our drama sessions

Knots Arts drama sessions run in East Sheen and are an exciting place for children aged 4 – 16 years old with social communication difficulties to come and make new friends whilst having fun.

Drama sessions consist of games and activities which are designed to support the development of team working, processing and understanding and speech and language. Each session begins with a sharing of news from our week, followed by drama games appropriate to the ability of the group and culminating in a drama activity such as story-telling, physical theatre or improvisation.

Job description:

The post holder will:

- Support the Drama Leader in the delivery of hour long drama sessions in a sensitive and inclusive manner.
- Support the Drama Leader with the planning of the sessions as and where necessary.
- Model positive behaviour with an enthusiastic and encouraging manner.
- Step in to leader parts of the session should the Drama Leader need to deal with an incident or speak with a parent during the session.
- Help new volunteers to understand and support the individual needs of each child during sessions.
- Attend termly staff and volunteer meetings and training as required.

Personal specification:

Essential

Candidates must:

- Have a willingness and enthusiasm for working with children in a drama based capacity.
- Understand the additional needs associated with working with neurodiverse children/children with social communication difficulties.
- Be organised and punctual
- Be willing to support the Drama Leader in giving brief verbal feedback to parents at the end of sessions as necessary. Be willing to undergo an enhanced DBS check for Knots Arts.

Desirable

- Have some previous experience of working with neurodiverse children or those with other learning or social communication difficulties.
- Have the confidence and ability to lead sessions in the absence of the Drama Leader.
- Have a drama or performing arts background.
